Reflections on Jesus' Ascension

On the feast of the Ascension, we are called to rejoice both in Jesus' victory over sin and death and in the glorious life that he has secured for us. We pray that we would experience the new life that is ours in Christ. Three aspects of that new life stand out in the second optional Mass reading for the feast: "May you know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19).

As Christians, our hope is secure because it rests in Jesus' death and resurrection. Because Jesus has overcome sin forever, we can live in freedom and peace no matter what situations we may face. We have been reconciled to God. We are no longer strangers. Every day, we can live in confidence knowing that our God is with us to strengthen and comfort us. Our hope is also founded in the inheritance Jesus won for us—none other than being with our Father forever, knowing him intimately, in all his splendor and beauty. In his ascension, Jesus has opened the door for us. Though we are sinners, we have been forgiven and redeemed. We are now fully loved and accepted as God's children, and we will live with him forever.

As we live every day in the hope of our eternal inheritance, however, we can begin to taste these blessings here and now. This is part of the "immeasurable greatness of his power in us who believe." Before he returned to his Father, Jesus promised his disciples that anyone who believed in him would be able to cast out demons, heal the sick, and perform signs and wonders in his name (Mark 16:17-18). How? By the power of the Holy Spirit, who lives inside of us. The same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is in our hearts, inviting us to yield to him and empowering us to live in the victory of the resurrection. No challenge is too great for a child of God!

Points for Meditation:

• As the disciples watched Jesus being lifted up to heaven, do you think that they would have been tempted to feel abandoned and panicked about their risen Lord leaving the earth? Think of a time in your life when you felt as if Jesus had abandoned you. How can Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:5,8) bring you comfort at such a time?

• Exercise your hope today by calling to mind Jesus' death and resurrection and the salvation he won for you on the cross. How can you more fully place your hope and confidence in these truths?

• Have you "tasted" the blessings here and now of your eternal inheritance? Ask God for a powerful outpouring of his Spirit so that he can manifest his power in your life.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, we rejoice today in your ascension to the Father's right hand. Thank you, Lord, for offering us a share in your heavenly life. By your Spirit, help us to lay hold of our inheritance in you—the hope, the glory, and the power that are the right of every child of God.

The Blessed Mother Teaches Mothers

Through Mary, we have the ultimate example of exemplary motherhood, of how to be the best mother to our children (and our nieces and nephews and friends' children) that we can possibly be.

In the Annunciation story, the Archangel Gabriel says to Mary, "Do

not be afraid." A celestial being is standing in her doorway telling her that the Lord is with her! For an unwed girl in first century Judea, being pregnant could lead to death. How can she not be afraid? Thankfully, Mary is full of grace!

In the early days of motherhood, fear can take the shape of leaning over the edge of the bassinet during the middle of the night and needing assurance that her infant has not stopped breathing. Our children grow and change, and so do our fears. Mary reminds us that trust in God is the antidote to fear.

Mary doesn't seek to avoid the situations that could cause fear, but instead turns towards them with the knowledge that God is beside her and within her, accompanying her through uncharted territory. God is with today's mothers as well!

Thinking of the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary, we are reminded of how potentially difficult the journey of motherhood could be for us. Life is full of challenges, and as mothers, we not only have our own challenges to face, but those of our children as well. As the old saying goes, a mother is only as happy as her least happy child.

Jesus' way of the cross caused tremendous suffering for Mary as it did for Jesus. However, Mary reminds us that we are not alone when we suffer alongside our children. In walking the way of the cross with Jesus, Mary tells mothers everywhere not to give up, even when things seem at their very worst, because there is more to the story than we can see from our vantage point. She reminds us to stand with our children at the crucifixion and to have hope in the resurrection.

Let us filled with thanksgiving, rejoice that the Blessed Virgin Mother is our spiritual mother who loves us, guides us, and teaches us to trust in confidence in Our Heavenly Father divine will.
