What is 1st Saturday Devotion?

Offering reparation for the blasphemies and offenses committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

How does one honor Our Blessed Mother through this devotion?

On the First Saturday of each month, during any five consecutive months of the year, do these four things, each as a fervent act of reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for the blasphemies and offenses which Our Blessed Mother suffers through the sins of mankind: receive Holy Communion on the 1st Saturday Mass (this does not include the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evenings); make a good Confession within 8 days of 1st Saturday; recite 5 decades of the Rosary on that 1st Saturday; and, meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary on that 1st Saturday.

TEACHINGS ON THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.

CCC 1382 The Paschal Banquet. The Mass is at the same time, and inseparably, the sacrificial memorial in which the sacrifice of the cross is perpet-

uated and the sacred banquet of communion with the Lord's body and blood. But the celebration of the Eucharistic sacrifice is wholly directed toward the intimate union of the faithful with Christ through communion. To receive communion is to receive Christ himself who has offered himself for us.

PRIEST'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners.

Last week I introduced myself to the summer camp staff and counselors at Archbishop Neale School, and spoke with them about the importance of meditating on scripture and how this leads to drawing closer to the Kingdom of God.

Beginning with a passage from the gospel of Mark, I asked the camp leaders to compare Jesus' words, "to love God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" - with the scribe's words to love Him, "with all your heart, with all your understanding, and with all your strength." I asked them to study the two word sets: 1) heart, soul, mind, strength, and 2) heart, understanding, strength, and after pondering them to determine what two words from group (1) are used to define the word "understanding" from group (2). The student who replied said correctly: "To love God with all your understanding is to love Him with your whole soul and mind." Yes, if we permit Jesus and the Holy Spirit dwelling within our souls to guide our minds, then we love God and our neighbor with complete understanding... and Jesus tells us when we do, we are not far from the Kingdom of God. (Mk 12:34)

Then I asked the camp leaders what they thought Jesus meant when He said in John 9:39-41, "I came into the world for judgement, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Again a student explained correctly that those who see or view things in a worldly way are blinded from the ways the Spirit desires to lead us. But when we choose to allow the graces of the Holy Spirit and Jesus to guide us, what we would otherwise be incapable of seeing becomes clear and understandable.

Lastly, we discussed scripture from Genesis chapter 2-3. After Adam and Eve had eaten the fruit... "The eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; [so they covered themselves]." I explained that after their eyes were opened, they became blind to the things of God because of their disobedience... because they engaged their minds as if they were gods and not children of their Creator. If Adam and Eve would have loved God with all their understanding, with all their mind and soul in unison, they would have remained innocent (blind to the ways of the world), and God would have protected their spiritual vision – keeping them in the Garden, unashamed of their nakedness.

I closed sharing my concern over the abundance of imagery – visual and mind-filled – men and woman can access, by the frenzy of communication methods. But reminded them if they love God with all their understanding, with all their mind and soul, then Jesus and the Holy Spirit who reside in their souls will give them the spiritual eyesight to recognize right from wrong and avoid the sins of pornography and lust that wants to penetrate their minds. And Jesus who sees them responding with understanding will say, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God.

Humanae Vitae (On Human Life)

Last Thursday, July 25th, was the anniversary of Humanae Vitae, Pope St. Paul VI's encyclical on contraception and reproductive ethics. His writings reaffirm long-

held Church teachings about human nature and new life, but also explained how this wisdom is to be applied in our modern culture.

- #1. God is the author of life, and the lives He creates are sacred. God wills into existence every life brought into the world as part of His plan for creation. We are made in His image and likeness and as the Supreme Creator, it is He who has mastery over life and death. To interfere with life between conception and natural death is in essence usurping God's ultimate authority.
- #2. Procreation is the heart of Marriage. The marital relationship of complete love is privileged to be the instrument God uses to bring new lives into the world. Marriage is designed for procreation on both the spiritual and physical levels, and children are the "supreme gift" of marriage.
- # 3. Openness to procreation affirms the dignity of women. Humanae Vitae points out that when a woman's sacred ability to give life is taken away through contraception, her role in a sexual encounter will often be that of an object of pleasure.
- # 4. This does not mean that it is always God's will for a couple to conceive.
- # 5. Couples may take advantage of infertile periods provided by God to temporarily avoid conception.

Both points of #4 and #5 were explained last week through Natural Family Planning (NFP).

- # 6. Artificial birth control is a recipe for cultural disaster. In Humanae Vitae, Pope St. Paul VI writes that moral standards would be lowered, marital infidelity would increase, and disrespect for womanhood would follow.
- # 7. Change the culture, instead of ignoring the moral law that "doesn't fit" our culture. Fertility is not a disease, it is a gift. No solution is permissible if it violates the dignity of man and woman, made in God's image.

Humanae Vitae gives the Church's answer to questions of love and child rearing between married couples, specifically questions that have arisen from the conditions of the modern world. May we be open to its beautiful message! Amen!
